LEAGUE OF WOMEN VOTERS PUBLISHES CANDIDATE SURVEY;
WILL HOST DISTRICT 101 CANDIDATE FORUM NOVEMBER 7

NAPLES, October 19—The League of Women Voters of Collier County, a nonpartisan organization, has published a survey of the candidates for the Florida Representative District 101 Special Election on the League website and will host a candidate forum on November 7.

The survey is intended to help inform voters before the primary elections this month and the general election on November 20. The election is being held to fill the vacancy left by the death of Representative Mike Davis.

“The League has a long tradition of voter education,” said Chris Straton, president of the Collier County League. “We ask candidates critical questions in surveys and at candidate forums to help educate voters prior to going to the polls. Results of this survey can be viewed on our website— www.lwvcolliercounty.org.”

The public is invited to the District 101 Candidate Forum, hosted by the League on November 7 from 6-7 p.m. at the Board of County Commissioners Chambers, Harmon Turner Building at the Government Center. The session will be broadcast live on channel 11 or 16, depending on the cable provider.

Registered Republicans in District 101 may vote in their party primary at their precinct on October 30 or during early voting from October 22 through October 27, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m., at the Golden Gate Library, 4898 Coronado Parkway, Naples. The winner and Linda McDonald, the only Democrat candidate, will stand for election on November 20 when all registered voters in District 101 will have the opportunity to vote for the candidate of their choice.

The League’s candidate survey included questions about the candidates’ qualifications, priorities and what they consider the most challenging issue affecting District 101. Candidate responses are available on the League website, www.lwvcolliercounty.org or by calling the League at 263-4656.
