In a letter published Friday, Dave Trecker, president of the Greater Naples Better Government Council (GNBGC), concluded his endorsement for Collier County commission candidates by stating: "Unless Democrat challengers emerge, the election will be decided in the primary on Aug. 24."

Unfortunately, this is not the case. Any challenger from any political party or even a write-in candidate will force the race to the general election in November. In fact, a challenger from the Constitution Party of Florida has emerged in the Collier County Commission District 2 race.

Anyone wishing to participate in selecting the Republican candidate for Collier County Commission District 2 must be registered with the Supervisor of Elections Office as a Republican by July 26, 2010.
